The National Palace Museum in Taipei contains more than 720,000 Chinese artifacts. including sculptures, pottery, woodcarvings, and paintings. Because of the size limitations of the museum, only 15,000 items can be displayed at any time. The rest are stored in the basement until they are rotated into the collection.

General Information

No one will be admitted to any convention event at the Taipei International Convention Center (TICC) or Linkou Stadium without a Kiwanis convention badge.

Kiwanis International Board Policy strictly prohibits clubs, organizations, companies, or individuals from selling or soliciting goods or services at or within the convention facilities during the Kiwanis International Convention. This policy includes the sale of buttons and pins. The only exceptions to this policy are the Kiwanis International Supply Booth, the Kiwanis International Foundation Booth, and Kiwanis International subcontracted vendors. Any person, organization, company, or club found to be in violation of this policy will be asked to leave the premises.

Calling Home

GENERAL INFORMATION

Taiwan's telecommunications system is among the best in Asia. When you are in Taiwan, you can dial "100" to reach an international operator, but direct dialing is reliable and much cheaper.

If you are calling from your hotel room, first ask the hotel operator how much the hotel surcharge is. You may decide you want to call Country Direct, which is cheaper. Otherwise, dial the international access code—oo2 or o12—the country code, the area or city code, and the local phone number.

Country Direct calls are available due to a cooperative effort among several large telephone systems. This service enables you to bypass the local telephone system and reach the US or another country directly on that country's system. First dial the access code—oo8o-1o288-o; a recording or an operator will offer you the option of using your home country calling card or a credit card, or making a collect call.

Convention Daily

Be sure to pick up the *Convention Daily*, which contains additional convention information, feature articles, and schedules of activities. The *Daily* will be available in two editions—Saturday/Sunday and Monday/Tuesday—and will be distributed throughout the convention center.

Credentials

All clubs in good standing are entitled to two delegates and two alternates, each of whom must be certified. If the certificate bearing the signatures of both the club president and club secretary was not sent to Kiwanis International before a delegate's arrival, it must be presented as soon as possible at the Credentials Desk. A delegate elected at the last minute to replace someone previously certified must present official verification of the change, signed by both the club president and club secretary.

NO DELEGATE MAY RECEIVE CREDENTIALS TO REPRESENT A CLUB THAT IS PAST DUE IN ITS FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS TO KIWANIS INTERNATIONAL.

Cultural Forums

Convention attendees will have opportunities to view cultural demonstrations on Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday. On Sunday, learn the ancient Chinese art of calligraphy; on Monday, master the age-old skill of paper cutting; and on Tuesday, discover how to knot colorful rope into beautiful art pieces. Please note that attendance is limited to only 80 participants per demonstration on a first-come, first-served basis.

Currency

Taipei has many facilities for currency exchange. Foreign currencies can be exchanged at the airport, government-designated banks, and most hotels. Receipts are given when currency is exchanged and must be presented to exchange unused New Taiwan (NT) dollars before departure. Major credit cards are accepted, and traveler's checks can be cashed at some tourist hotels. At time of print, the exchange rate for the following currencies was:

One US Dollar (USD)=32.90 New Taiwan dollars (NT)
One Canadian Dollar (CAD)=21.03 New Taiwan dollars (NT)
One Euro (EUR)=29.71 New Taiwan dollars (NT)

First Aid

First aid at the Taipei International Convention Center is located just off of Plenary Hall on the 3rd floor, in the northeast corner opposite the restrooms. The first aid room will be open during official convention functions.
